Partnering to Provide Activity Kits to Summit County Youth

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NEED

Extension regularly partners with library systems to provide outreach and education. The COVID-19 pandemic created challenges for both Extension and libraries who were unable to provide these services in traditional ways. The Summit County (Ohio) Extension office partnered with the Akron Summit County Public Libraries to create activity kits for 3rd-5th grade youth who were not able to participate in regularly scheduled summer activities.

OBJECTIVES

The objectives of this project were to:

- provide activities for 3rd-5th grade youth in Summit County, OH
- maintain Master Gardener Volunteer (MGV) engagement during the pandemic
- engage with a trusted community partner to achieve outreach goals during a challenging time

METHODS

The Summit County Master Gardeners Volunteers suggested topics that they were interested in developing into a simple activity using easily obtained materials. Two themes emerged: nature and gardening. A two-page, branded direction sheet was developed for each activity. The direction sheets, items needed to complete the activity, and other supporting materials were placed in either an individual paper or plastic bag. For example, the Wildflower Seed Ball kit contained a package of seeds and ball of clay, along with the instruction sheet. In total, activity kits were developed on twelve different topics ranging from growing microgreens to creating a nature journal. Materials were supplied via donated materials or natural materials gathered by the (MGVs) and the Summit Akron Public Libraries provided printing services. For each topic created, sets of twenty kits were distributed to nineteen library branches for a total of 380 kits per activity. Youth were able pick up the activities to complete at home for free. A Facebook live was created for each of the kits to provide a demonstration of how to use the materials in the kit.




What is in this kit?

RESULTS

In total, 4,940 kits were distributed throughout Summit County. Twelve Facebook Live videos were created with a total of 594 views. Summit County Master Gardeners contributed approximately 200 volunteer hours to this project.

EVALUATION

Participating librarians were surveyed to determine the usefulness of the program.
