Land Use Revalidation Forms

For landowners currently in the Land Use taxation program, the revalidation forms were mailed from the Real Estate Assessor's office in mid-late March. Revalidation forms are used to verify that your land is still being used for the production of crops, timber, pasture, or a combination thereof. **Please complete your forms and return them by June 5th**. By keeping your forms current, you can take advantage of paying real estate taxes on the value of agricultural land use versus the higher rates of market value.

New Land Use Forms

New applications to qualify for land use taxation are also being accepted and are due by May 1st.

ARP Interest Payments

The next interest payment processing date for current participants will be **June 5, 2019**. Installment Purchase Agreement Options

Did you know that your Installment Purchase Agreement (IPA) is a tradeable investment, just like any other stocks or bonds?

Once a participant has held an IPA for a full year, the investment can be sold for cash. The market is fairly liquid on these securities should an ARP participant need to sell the IPA. Your financial planner or broker can help you with this type of transaction, or our office can put you in contact with willing buyers. Expect to sell at a discount from the full-face value.



What to Do With Your Tax Refund?

Applying your tax refund to pay off bills, putting a percentage in savings for emergencies and saving for retirement are the best things you can do with your Tax Refund. The Consumer Financial Protection Bureau suggests the following steps to save your tax refund.

Step (1) Plan ahead to save some part of your tax refund.

Most people plan how they are going to spend their refund prior to receiving it. It is important to include savings in your plans. Setting aside 25% of your refund to be placed into your savings will help when an emergency occurs or when you need extra cash to meet a financial obligation.

Step (2) Use a separate account for savings or even a different financial institution.

This strategy will help limit impulsive use of funds allocated for savings.

Step (3) Automatically deposit some of your refund into a separate account when you file your return.

You can use the tax form to indicate to the IRS the amount of funds to apply to checking and the remaining into savings. Further, making a plan for your money is the first step to develop a Spending Plan (Budget), so when you received your tax refund you will already know the bills you will pay and the amount that will be applied to your savings. Also, according to America Saves, those who have a savings plan are twice as likely to save successfully.


