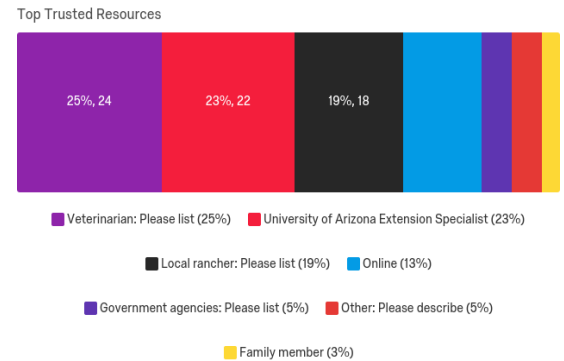
Introduction
As a result of continued support of Dr. Betsy Greene, equine resources have reemerged in San Carlos Apache community. Dr. Betsy Greene has offered to expand resources in San Carlos that the interest of Equine resources has provided momentum for more training offered by Cooperative Extension. Also, Dr. Betsy willingness to support programs provided a pathway for another specialist in the area to combine resources and training to create a curriculum to reach a diversity of community members in San Carlos Apache Tribe

ABSTRACT
In response to requests from San Carlos Cattle Associations, the San Carlos Bureau of Indian Affairs, and the Natural Resource Conservation San Carlos District, and community members a series of workshops were developed to bring both classroom and hands-on information to ranchers in the areas of equine and cattle health. Two workshops held so far in San Carlos. On May 30th, 32 ranchers and farmers attended a classroom session focused on Hot Diseases of horses and cattle, Nutritional Value of Forage, Basic Animal Care, Vaccinations for Horse. Featured speakers included Tara Timpson, DVM (Kanab, UT), Betsy Greene, Ph.D. (UofA) and Area Agents Ashley Wright, and Ashley Hall from Arizona Cooperative Extension. A follow-up hands-on session that included body condition scoring of cattle and horses, BVD testing cattle, and horse vitals took place on June 20th at the Dripping Springs Sale Facility in San Carlos.

Purchase traveling chute to reach community members in different districts. Also, request to purchase floating teeth model, vaccination coolers models, tagging materials, livestock visuals to help with education and hands-on activities. 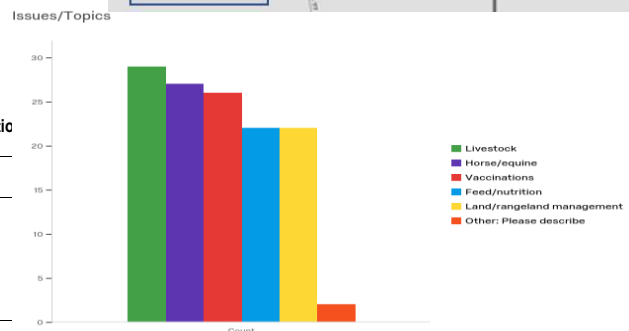
