MISSION: Adult Public Education Outreach for the Environmental Protection of Natural Water Resources and the MS4 permit awareness. The goal is to make ourselves available to citizens and share with them how we all can be good stewards of the environment. Stormwater Utility and Environmental Services housed in the Engineering Division in collaboration with UGA Extension- Columbia County presented interesting hands on workshops and sessions sharing vast knowledge & expertise. Topics: "Environment Matters" combined with "Introduction to Soils" lesson, "Management of Tools for Turfgrasses", and "Understanding Fertilizer" lessons.

By forming this partnership programming, we were able to educate the fact when rain hits hard impervious surfaces and pollutants quickly travel to the natural water resources. Citizen's landscapes, grass and plantings, can help reduce pollutants from entering our vital natural waters by slowing down water runoff and acting as a filter. We demonstrated this on an Enviroscape table model and the UGA Extension County Agent educated citizens how to be successful in managing landscapes, with many options of various plantings and turfgrasses, with minimal pollutants entering our waterways.
