Arbor Day and Tree Planting Week


The Governor of Mississippi designates the second Friday in February as Arbor Day and the following week as Tree Planting Week. This year Arbor Day will be observed on February 12th. Tree planting week will be observed February 12th through February 19th.

The Pontotoc Forestry Association has provided you with loblolly pine seedlings to plant on Arbor day or during Tree Planting Week.

There are a variety of reasons to plant trees. Trees can be planted, to honor loved ones, for wind breaks, to reduce soil erosion, to provide a screen from neighbors, for wildlife habitat improvement, or for timber production.

Before planting your trees, it is important to choose the best location. You should consider how big the trees will be when they mature. Your loblolly pines could live more than 50 years and grow to be 100 feet tall! Do not plant the trees too close to your house or near power lines. It is also important to avoid underground utility lines and septic lines.

It is finally time to plant your trees! The following illustration from the Mississippi State University Extension Service Publication, "4-H Forestry Project No. 1 Tree Planting" will help you properly plant your trees.
