





Most of the topics were good. A few webinars I only cared about 1 of the three topics.


Depends on the topic

Would be helpful to have the slide sets posted shortly after the presentations if possible.


I am most interested in the economic analyses and implications that experts can offer.




I was able to write a comprehensive story for our readers that gave them good information on managing their farm.

To what extent were you able to use what you learned to make better crop management decisions?






Attended to learn about the timely updates

My only recommendation would be to hold the meeting in the morning rather than over the noon hour.


Didn't like that I had to register ahead of time and be sent a link to participate.

Were the webinars offered at a good time for you? (As a reminder, they were offered every other week, on Wednesdays from 12:30-1:30 pm)




