Drive-thru lighted tractor parade in Stoneboro draws huge response from decorators, community

STONEBORO — The Christmas spirit was alive, well and well-lit in Stoneboro, Saturday, as the Mercer County Ag Council presented the Tractors & Tinsel drivethru event at the Stoneboro Fairgrounds, drawing dozens of tractors and hundreds of cars.

Normally part of Christmas Magic in Sandy Lake, the parade is in its third year, but because of COVID-19 it became its own stand-alone, drivethru event that drew a huge line of families in cars hoping to take it all in.

"We've had a great response," said co-organizer Nancy McDowell. "I think people are grateful for the opportunity to get out and do something."

The event has blossomed from the 23 tractors which participated in the first parade to 60 entries spaced around the fairgrounds on Saturday.

Admission to the event was free, but a collection of canned goods was accepted to benefit the Lakeview Helping Hands food pantry.

Stoneboro, Sandy Lake and Coolspring churches came together to perform a live Nativity scene in front of the

grandstand.

The Dairy Princesses of Mercer County handed out string cheese and pints of chocolate milk to remind everyone to get their dairy in their daily diet.

Ginger and Matt Fenton again set up their tractor with the famous leg lamp from the movie "A Christmas Story." Ginger again donned the pink bunny jammies Ralphie wore in the movie.



Andy Gnarley and his family were participating in Tractors & Tinsel for the first time.

"I thought it was a good cause," Gnarley said.

Organizers estimated 2,000 cars went through the parade.
