

Each year, a Regional Corn Field Day is held at the North Florida Research and Education Center-Suwannee Valley where the Variety Trial is a stop in the tour.

At the end of the season, the participating agents assist the NFREC-SV farm crew with harvesting the variety trial plot.




Last season, the center purchased a small plot harvester that collected the data while harvesting.
