In the many roles that Gene has served at the local, state, national and international levels, he has distinguished himself as an exemplary Extension Educator at every level. In fact, Gene has been an "Extension" Educator his entire adult life, well before he was affiliated with UF IFAS Extension. Upon graduation from Rutgers, Gene served both extension type and humanitarian roles internationally with both the Peace Corps and the US Agency for International Development in Niger, West Africa. Gene's Hall of Fame level of success as an Extension Educator is driven by his love of agriculture and a true desire to help others in any ways that he can. I have seen this desire to help others expressed in many different ways; primarily in his life's role as an educator, but also as a worker bee. I have witnessed Gene spending many hours outside of "office-hours", helping to raise money for scholarships for deserving students, mentoring young agents and 4-H members and working in his church and his community to lend a hand wherever there is a need.

I had the pleasure (and the fortune) to meet Gene professionally in 2004, when I was working as an Agriscience teacher at a local school. Since then I have interacted with Gene in many different roles including as a client, an employee and a peer.
