Ladies Raising Livestock is an initiative designed to empower female producers by providing education, networking, and resources tailored to their unique challenges. This event brings together industry professionals, extension specialists, and experienced producers to discuss key aspects of livestock management, including farm financials, veterinary practices, marketing strategies, and adaptive tools for efficiency. By fostering a supportive community and amplifying women's voices in agriculture, Ladies Raising Livestock seeks to bridge the rural-urban disconnect and strengthen the future of livestock production.

Demographics

The Ladies Raising Livestock Conference successfully provided education and training to participants on a variety of agricultural topics, with measurable growth in knowledge across all sessions. Attendees showed a significant increase in understanding, with the highest improvement seen in the Storytelling in Agriculture session, which had a 48% increase in knowledge.




Figure 1. Pie chart of Ladies Raising Livestock Conference participants role on agricultural operations.

She encouraged attendees to embrace their agricultural journeys with confidence and purpose, helping to create a more inclusive and impactful industry.

Overall 88% of participants reported the tradeshow to be valuable to expanding their operations.




Figure 2. Percent increase in knowledge of each topic presented at Ladies Raising Livestock Conference.
