# **Equine Welfare Assessment Skills Certification Course**

#### Authors

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#### **Problem**

- Livestock contribute \$1.59 billion in economic impact in the state of Georgia
- 12.1% or \$192 million is attributed to Georgia's equine industry
- Rise of social license to operate and scrutiny of animal agriculture regarding animal welfare and husbandry practices
- Stakeholders include state agencies, law enforcement 501(c)3 and private equine rescues, veterinarians, and others
- Individuals responding to equine welfare concerns may lack agricultural background or education on acceptable equine welfare and management practices

#### Response

- 3-day Equine Welfare Assessment Skills Certification Course piloted in 2024.
- Target audience: law enforcement, state agencies, animal control, equine rescues, veterinarians.
- Topics included: social license to operate, best practices for non-profits, defining equine welfare, behavior and handling of horses, trailer safety and equine transportation, body condition scoring, equine health management and equine nutrition.
- Post-retrospective evaluation completed by participants to assess program impact
- Certificate of completion provided to those who passed a competency exam at the conclusion of the course.

## Response & Demographics

- 35 participants
- 7 states (GA, NC, SC, VA, WV, ME, TX)
- Experience in equine welfare ranged from 1 to 40+ years
- Diverse representation of equine industry stakeholders
  - 3% veterinarians
  - 42.9% Equine Rescue
  - 25.5% State Agencies
    - 28.6% "Other" primarily animal control





- Excellent satisfaction with presenters (70%) and take-home materials (71%).


## **Program Impact**
