Ag Values & Ag Leasing Education

Farm Management – On My Own programs provide essential risk management education to older female landowners and farm operators in Missouri, particularly those who are single, widowed, and divorced. By addressing the educational needs of this underserved group, these programs empower participants to make informed decisions that mitigate financial and legal risks.

Missouri's Older Female Farmers:

- 36% of Missouri farmers are female
- 38% of Missouri farmers are age 65 and older

Female Farmers' Decision-Making:

- Less involved in: land use and/or crop, day-to-day, marketing, and livestock decisions
- More involved in: record-keeping and financial management decisions

Farm Management – On My Own programs provide education in financial and legal risk categories:

- Financial: Farmland values, rental rates, custom work costs
- Legal: Ag leasing and ag lease agreements

Program Content & Partners

Risk management education is the core of the participant-driven, learner-focused program. Female farmers learn how to reduce financial and legal risks associated with ag leasing, lease agreements, and custom work.




