2025 SERVICE TO AMERICAN/WORLD AGRICULTURE AWARD RECIPIENT

Justen Smith

Executive Director of Extension Agriculture & Natural Resources Department & Extension Professor
Utah State University

Justen Smith has dedicated his career to advancing agricultural education, extension programming, and global outreach. He started with Utah State University Extension as an Assistant Professor and County Extension Agent in 2002, he quickly established himself as a leader in the field. He was promoted to Associate Professor in 2008, and reached the rank of Extension Professor in 2017.



Over the past 26 years, Justen has played a pivotal role in strengthening agricultural systems and improving the lives of farmers both in the United States and across the world.

Professional Experience and Leadership

As the Director and Department Head of the Extension Agriculture and Natural Resources Department at Utah State University, Justen has led statewide extension programs, ensuring that farmers and agricultural professionals have access to the latest research, training, and resources. His leadership as State Agriculture Extension Program Leader has further expanded the reach of these programs, benefiting communities throughout Utah and beyond.

Throughout his career, Justen has successfully secured over \$11 million in grants and external funding, directly supporting extension initiatives and agricultural development. One of his notable achievements was leading the effort to secure \$1.2 million in funding for the construction of the USU Extension building in Davis County, providing a dedicated space for agricultural education and outreach.

In addition to administrative leadership, Justen has created and implemented innovative programs that have left a lasting impact. His Cultures Around the World Youth Diversity Education Program has broadened students' understanding of global agricultural practices, while the 4-H High Adventure Program has provided hands-on learning experiences for youth interested in agriculture and natural resources.

International Impact

Justen's expertise in livestock management and agricultural extension services has been recognized on a global scale. He has worked in 24 countries across Africa, the Middle

East, Latin America, and beyond, providing critical technical assistance to farmers and agricultural organizations. His work with USAID, USDA, and international NGOs has helped to improve livestock production, enhance food security, and develop sustainable agricultural practices in diverse regions. His contributions in Iraq, for example, have been particularly impactful. He helped establish Iraq's first feed analysis laboratories, provided technical training for newly-formed 4-H Sheep Clubs, and assisted in the development of commercial cattle and sheep feedlots throughout the country. In South Sudan and Uganda, Justen played a key role in drafting a 25-year master plan for agricultural infrastructure, a project that will guide the nation's agricultural growth for decades to come.

From Lebanon to Armenia, Paraguay to the Philippines, Justen has worked with local farmers, government agencies, and universities to improve agricultural education and extension systems. Whether advising the U.S. Embassy in Lebanon on emergency livestock aid or working with dairy producers in Uganda, his efforts have led to tangible improvements in food production and sustainability worldwide.

Research and Creative Accomplishments

Justen's influence extends beyond direct service—his research and scholarly work have contributed significantly to agricultural knowledge and best practices. He has authored or co-authored 13 peer-reviewed journal articles, 6 peer-reviewed abstracts, 12 technical guides, 10 fact sheets, a handbook, and 11 published proceedings. His expertise has been sought after at international conferences, where he has delivered presentations on agricultural development, livestock management, and extension methodologies.

His ability to translate research into action is evident in the large-scale outreach events he has organized. USU Baby Animal Days, which he launched in 2012, has attracted over 35,000 attendees, providing families with an opportunity to learn about agriculture and animal husbandry while generating crucial funding for extension programs. The 4-H Donated Meat Program, another of his initiatives, has provided over 1 million pounds of meat to food banks and families in need.

Recognition and Lasting Impact

Justen's career is marked by a relentless commitment to improving agriculture at home and abroad. His work has transformed extension programming in Utah, provided critical agricultural support in developing countries, and shaped the next generation of agricultural professionals through education and mentorship. His efforts have strengthened food security, promoted sustainability, and fostered international collaboration in ways that will have a lasting impact for years to come.

For 20 years, Cody Stone has engaged clientele and faculty through his work with Extension in Texas and Montana. In Texas, he served as an Extension Agent, 4-H Specialist, and Regional Program Director. as the Volunteer and Leadership Development Specialist before becoming the Director of the 4-H Center and State 4-H Program Leader. He holds a Bachelor's and Master's degree from Texas A&M University and a Doctorate in Adult and Higher Education from Montana State University.

Dwayne Fisher had the privilege of growing up in small town America, Parma, Idaho. Active in 4-H and FFA his entire life. He served as the Idaho State FFA President from 1993-94. That same



year his long-time best friend, who he met at the county fair as teens, served as the Idaho State FFA Secretary. Two years after their officer service, they were married. Dwayne and Tracy are the parents of 8 kids and now enjoy grandparent life with their 8 grand kids. Dwayne graduated with his bachelor's degree from Boise State University in Marketing Management. Upon graduation they moved to his aunt and uncle's farm in Homedale, Idaho to help run the family business and raise their family. He, along with his cousin and 3 of their children or children's spouses are currently running their row crop farm and onion packing facility. Dwayne is also the VP of Marketing and partner

at Champion Produce Sales. The team at Champion markets for five onion packing facilities year-round and distribute around 100 semi loads of onions each week across the nation. When not growing and selling onions, Dwayne & Tracy, along with their family run a club lamb & goat operation with 300 head of mature ewes and 40 head of does. They do extensive Embryo transfer work and market their livestock across the nation. Dwayne and Tracy are active members of their church and serve in many capacities. Dwayne is also the Vice-Chairman of the Homedale School District.
