They represent a careful search by the members of each State Recognition and Awards Committee, each of the State Associations of County Agricultural Agents and the coordination of these efforts by the Regional and National Committee members.

These NACAA recipients represent the wonderful work that is being carried out across the nation by the membership of the association. Our humble congratulations to each honoree.

County Agents Receiving the DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD

From The National Association of County Agricultural Agents 2025

Winners are listed by regions and states.

WESTERN REGION - CALIFORNIA David Haviland - 22 Years

David's crucial research in development of sustainable pest management practices for crops such as almonds, pistachios and grapes has provided growers with effective responses to invasive pests, improved reliance on biological control, and increased adoption of environmentally-safe techniques such as mating disruption. His extension efforts, including more than 500 publications and over 800 invited presentations have led to industry-wide impacts that are expansive. He recently served the Entomological Society of America as Pacific Branch President.



WESTERN REGION - COLORADO

Travis Taylor - 15 Years



Travis Taylor has served CSU Extension as Golden Plains Area Livestock Specialist since 2019. Previously, he served as the Lincoln County Director, after working at the University of Wyoming. Travis continues to serve agricultural producers across Colorado, as a Trainer for Colorado Beef Quality Assurance, Superintendent for the Colorado State Fair, and the National Western Wool show. Travis co-produces the Pasture to Profit podcast, designed to inform producers of industry updates and current production practices.

WESTERN REGION - IDAHO Doug Finkelnburg - 12 Years

Doug Finkelnburg is an Area Extension Educator in north central Idaho providing continuing education opportunities for dryland production agriculture. Finkelnburg played an integral role in creating a regional "Pacific Northwest Herbicide Resistance Initiative" which annually directs USDA funds to three USDA-ARS units and three land grant universities creating collaborative opportunities to address this pressing production issue. He is also the lead Extension faculty for a \$55 million USDA Climate Smart Commodities grant in Idaho.



WESTERN REGION - MONTANA

Marc King - 30 Years



Marc is the Sweet Grass County Extension Agent in Big Timber, Montana. Marc started with MSU Extension in 1993. Sweet Grass County Extension is a single agent county, so the agent handles all aspects of extension including 4-H, agriculture, community development and FCS programing.

WESTERN REGION - NEW MEXICO

Jason Lamb - 19 Years

Jason Lamb has been an Agricultre Agent for New Mexico State Cooperative Extension Service for 19 years and has served the past eleven in Quay County. He has worked in single agent counties and understands the challenges of providing all program areas to a rural clientele. Jason has worked in a variety of programming areas in his career and most recently has had great success with the Beginning Farmer Program.



WESTERN REGION - OREGON Sergio Arispe - 11 Years



Sergio has served OSU Extension in Malheur County since 2014, leading impactful education and research programs for livestock producers. He coordinates Oregon's Beef Quality Assurance and Secure Beef and Dairy Supply programs, offering training statewide and across the Western U.S. A dedicated member of the Oregon Agricultural Extension Association, Sergio has held leadership roles at both state and national levels. His work exemplifies excellence in outreach, technical skills, professional development, and service.

WESTERN REGION - UTAH Michael Caron - 11 Years

Michael Caron has been researching the suitability of hardy wine and table grape cultivars for Utah's climate for ten years. More recently, he has been working on market research and consumer demand determination for grapes in Utah as a commercial crop. Specialty crop growers and hobby farmers seek ways to diversify their product sales. He has also worked to validate wine grape evapotranspiration models to determine their suitability in Utah's cold, arid, high-elevation desert environment.



WESTERN REGION - WASHINGTON

Linda McLean - 16 Years



Linda McLean has been with WSU Extension for 16 years as an educator focused on youth, food sovereignty, and agriculture. As an enrolled member of the Colville Confederated Tribes, Linda is passionate about providing knowledge to Indigenous people, 4-H youth development, and food and livestock production. Through sciencebased meetings and workshops for both adults and youth on a variety of topics, she places great value in developing partnerships which align with the Extension mission.

WESTERN REGION - WYOMING Jeremiah Vardiman - 10 Years

Jeremiah Vardiman received the Distinguished Service Award in recognition of his dedicated service and excellence for the past 10 years with the University of Wyoming Extension. Over the past decade, Vardiman has been active with applied research projects and impactful Extension programs that have contributed to advancing Wyoming's agriculture. His commitment to professional development, collaboration, and delivering results to the stakeholders and clientele of Wyoming are distinguishable.



NORTH CENTRAL REGION - ILLINOIS

Ken Johnson - 11 Years



Ken Johnson is a shining example of Extension excellence. During his career with Illinois Extension Ken has led the charge to share his passion for entomology and horticulture with the communities he serves and the entire state of Illinois. Through needs assessments and evaluations, Johnson has focused his programs and writings on the topics needed most and the new and emerging topics such as the plight of pollinators. Johnson exemplifies the values of Extension/NACAA.

NORTH CENTRAL REGION - INDIANA

Danielle Walker - 12 Years

Danielle Walker has served as the Purdue Extension Agriculture and Natural Resources Educator in Washington County since 2012. A respected leader and collaborator, she has advanced Indiana's beef industry through programs like the Indiana Beef Evaluation Program, Indiana Master Cattleman, and Breeding Soundness Evaluation Clinics. Danielle's innovative outreach efforts in livestock production, and commitment to empowering women and farm families through education exemplify excellence in Extension and have made a lasting impact across her community.



NORTH CENTRAL REGION - IOWA

Jennifer Bentley - 15 Years



She is distinguished in service to Extension and her farm and agri-business clientele. Jennifer is held in high esteem by colleagues and Administration for high-quality programming; facilitative teaching ability; professional demeanor; empathetic communication skills; and sensitive personality. Her teaching contains highly research-based information and effective demonstrated practices, along with teaching methods beyond PowerPoint presentation. Over 20 invited presentations to industry and over 50 publications attest to her professional and scientific excellence the last 15 years.

NORTH CENTRAL REGION - KANSAS

Shannon Blocker - 22 Years

Shannon Blocker has been an extension agent for 22 years. She used an unmanned aerial system to test remote identification of sericea lespedeza and for other uses. She helped 4-H members use it for their practical application projects. Shannon's consultation on Farm Bill program choices made an \$865,350 difference in 2019. She developed soil fertility worksheets and curriculum on blue-green algae in livestock water. Shannon works with Master Gardeners and teaches soils for basic training.



NORTH CENTRAL REGION - KANSAS Krista Harding - 25 Years



Krista Harding has provided leadership in agricultural and horticultural programming thru K-State Research & Extension for 25 years. Krista began her career as an agricultural agent in Neosho county, working closely with producers as well as the 4-H program. She transitioned to a district horticulture agent for eleven years. Krista is currently the Director for the Southwind Extension District where she serves as the local administrative leader, overseeing the extension programming efforts across four counties.

NORTH CENTRAL REGION - MICHIGAN Benjamin Phillips - 11 Years

Benjamin Phillips holds a BS in fisheries & wildlife, a MS in Entomology and has been with Michigan State University Extension for 11.5 years. As a Vegetable Specialist based at the Southwest Michigan Research and Extension Center, he serves commercial field and greenhouse vegetable growers who target fresh, wholesale, and processing markets. MAEA has selected Ben as the 2025 Distinguished Service Award winner to recognize both his innovative vegetable programming and past service as President.



NORTH CENTRAL REGION - MINNESOTA

Emily Krekelberg - 12 Years



Emily started with University of Minnesota Extension in 2013 as a county educator in Central Minnesota focusing on dairy production. In 2020, her passion for farm safety led her to her role as a Farm Safety and Health Educator working statewide to implement Youth Tractor Safety Training, farm safety seminars, suicide prevention classes, and more. Emily is also proud to serve as a co-lead for the Ag for All Conference for LGBTQIA+ agriculturalists in Minnesota.

NORTH CENTRAL REGION - MISSOURI Charles Ellis - 33 Years

Charles Ellis has been an MU Extension Agricultural Engineering Field Specialist for over 33 years. His programming includes precision farming practices, notill crop production systems, livestock production, and cover crop management and strategies as a member of the Midwest Cover Crop Council. He serves as an Executive board member on the Midwest Cover Crop Council and assists in developing educational resources. Also, he works with crop producers participating in the Missouri Strip Trial program.



NORTH CENTRAL REGION - NEBRASKA

David Lott - 23 Years



David Lott is the horticulture educator in North Platte since 2010 and a NACAA member for 23 years. David contributed to grants valued over \$225,00 on vegetable research. He authored 11 NebGuides, a peer reviewed journal article and 14 regional and national presentations. He reached over 1.3 million mass and soicial media contacts. Programming has relaized conservation of 904,538 gallons of wate, and 21,889 pounds of pesticide. He also served as NCEA and ESP President.

NORTH CENTRAL REGION - NORTH DAKOTA

Brian Zimprich - 18 Years

I have served as the Agriculture and Natural Resources Extension Agent for Ransom County, ND for 20 years. During this time, I have conducted programs for area farmers and ranchers focused around soil health, and beef cattle production. In addition to my responsibilities as the Agriculture Agent, we have a very active county 4-H program and I serve as a co-chair to our state wide 4-H Animal Science Committee.



NORTH CENTRAL REGION - OHIO

Nanette Neal - 13 Years



Since 2011, Nanette has been an Agriculture and Natural Resources Educator in Clermont County. She leads programs focused on farm management, women in agriculture, beginning and small farms, and horticulture education. Nanette co-founded the Ohio Women in Agriculture Team, which offers vital risk management education and resources. She has held leadership roles in Ohio NACAA and Ohio JCEP, serving as president of both. Her work has impacted hundreds, supporting agriculture and community development throughout Ohio.

NORTH CENTRAL REGION - OHIO Eric Richer - 13 Years

Eric Richer is an associate professor and farm management field specialist with OSU Extension. His work includes farm business analysis, enterprise budgeting, beginning farmer planning, and valueadded enterprise analysis. He launched OSU's Farm On Financial Management Course which helps beginning farmers better understand key financial and risk management strategies. As a 10-year county educator, he conducted over 45 on farm research projects, led a malting barley peer group, and taught farm management and agronomy classes.



NORTH CENTRAL REGION - OHIO

Beth Scheckelhoff - 19 Years



Beth Scheckelhoff is an Assistant Professor and Agriculture and Natural Resources Educator in Putnam County. She provides resources and support to specialty crop and green industry producers, conducts on-farm agronomic research, teaches produce safety and good agricultural practices, and works with homeowners and Master Gardener Volunteers to address horticultural needs. She is a co-leader of the Ohio Women in Agriculture Team, President of the Conservation Tillage and Technology Conference, and President of Ohio ANREP.

NORTH CENTRAL REGION - WISCONSIN

Heather Schlesser - 12 Years

Heather Schlesser works closely with dairy producers to conduct educational programs and research. Heather focuses on farm stress, succession, cattle reproduction, and calf care. Heather has published articles on her work and has presented at several national meetings. Heather's research efforts resulted in her successfully achieving the rank of full professor in 2024. Heather is active in the state and national association as State President and the National Chair of the Sustainable Agriculture Committee.



NORTHEAST REGION - CONNECTICUT

Jacqueline Kowalski - 13 Years



Jacqueline Kowalski is the University of Connecticut's urban agriculture Extension Educator. She developed and coordinates the UConn Urban Farmer Training Program, an annual 8-month course to grow future urban farmers. Jacqueline has secured significant funding to advance conservation and urban agriculture equity and create pathways for urban farmland tenure. She also serves as the chair for the Northeast Region National Urban Extension Leaders network, working with other Northeast extension professionals to advance urban extension.

NORTHEAST REGION - MAINE Kate Garland - 14 Years

Kate Garland is a horticultural extension professional in Maine, specializing in the Master Gardener Volunteer program, school and community gardens, and food security. She transitioned Master Gardener training to an online format, revitalized a demonstration garden for schoolchildren, and has edited the Maine Home Garden News for over 10 years. Kate also cocoordinates Maine Harvest for Hunger, mobilizing volunteers to grow, glean, and distribute fresh produce to food security agencies across the state.



NORTHEAST REGION -MARYLAND

Jonathan Moyle - 11 Years



Jon Moyle, Extension Poultry Specialist. Research includes reproductive management, behavior in broiler breeders, improving organic and free-range poultry production, finding natural compounds to prevent and control disease. Educates through classes, on farm research to help growers improve production, sustainability, bird well-being. Assists growers to comply with and understand government regulations. Committed to help growers improve nutrient management, farm management, and biosecurity. Worked on 35 international projects

through Farmer-to-Farmer, other organizations assisting farmers throughout the world.

NORTHEAST REGION - NEW JERSEY Amy Rowe - 14 Years

Amy Rowe has worked in Extension for 14 years as a dual-county agent specializing in environmental issues and sustainability in northern New Jersey. She has brought in more than \$3 million in external funding for her projects, with a new focus on reducing food waste. She is a coordinator for both the Rutgers Environmental Stewards and Rutgers Master Gardener programs, while also mentoring pre-tenure faculty across extension.



NORTHEAST REGION - NEW YORK

Elizabeth Higgins - 18 Years



Elizabeth (Liz) Higgins, a regional Ag Business Management/Production Economics Specialist with the CCE Eastern NY Commercial Horticulture Program, serves specialty crop farmers across 17 counties in Eastern New York. Her focus is tree fruit, vegetable, berry, and grape farms. She also works with the Cornell Ag Workforce Development Program, providing training programs and extension outreach in human resource management for commercial fruit and vegetable farms. Her expertise is valued by the growers across her region.

NORTHEAST REGION - PENNSYLVANIA

Nicole Thompson - 12 Years

Nicole Santangelo Thompson is an Agronomy Educator in Potter County, Pennsylvania. Programs she has helped develop are derived from the interface of crops and livestock, a testament to the region. She conducts pesticide education and field crops programs across an eight-county area. Her most notable program successes include participation with the NIFA Water4Agriculture multistate project, creation of the Ag 101: Introduction to Agriculture online course and serving as the Pennsylvania State SARE Coordinator.



NORTHEAST REGION - WEST VIRGINIA John Murray - 19 Years



John Murray is an Extension Agent with West Virginia University and is located in Taylor County. His programming in recent years has focused on youth agriculture, feeder calf marketing, grazing management, and homeowner horticulture. As the only Agent in Taylor County, he has also been responsible for leading the 4-H program within the county since 2017 including volunteer recruitment and training, 4-H Camp, and project work.

SOUTHERN REGION - ALABAMA

Gavin Mauldin - 11 Years

Serving as Coffee County Extension Coordinator, Gavin promotes agricultural education through community and backyard gardening projects, serving on the Farm-City committee, and assisting the Coffee County 4-H livestock judging team. Gavin began his career as County Extension Coordinator in nearby Geneva County. Regionally, he serves as a steering committee member for the Wiregrass Cotton Expo, an annual production meeting and vendor tradeshow for cotton producers in Southeast Alabama.



SOUTHERN REGION - ALABAMA

Kristen Roberson - 18 Years



Kristen has served many roles during her 18-year Extension career and is a current County Coordinator. She has successfully resurrected one of the largest youth livestock programs in the state that had become extinct. A pair of 4-H volunteers instilled in her a love for Agriculture as a teenager. She strives to do the same for the youth she works with, and has a tremendous passion for being an advocate for local farmers and producers.

SOUTHERN REGION - ALABAMA David West - 31 Years

David West is a County Extension Coordinator in Calhoun County, Alabama. He launched the Master Gardener program there and developed the National Tree Trust Tree Amigos Nursery Program at Coosa Valley Youth Services, which has thrived for 30 years. Dr. West has served as President of the Alabama Urban Forestry Association and Legacy, Partners in Environmental Education. He has served as Alabama Arbor Day Coordinator for the AUFA for 27 years.

SOUTHERN REGION - FLORIDA

Kalan Taylor - 11 Years



Kalan Taylor is a County Extension Director and Natural Resources agent and has established herself as a leader in agriculture and natural resources through diverse programming for producers and youth. She has shared her expertise at numerous state and national conferences and has received several prestigious awards at local, state, regional, and national levels, recognizing her contributions to Extension.

SOUTHERN REGION - GEORGIA Joel Burnsed - 11 Years

Joel Burnsed is the Oconee and Walton County Extension Coordinator and Agriculture Agent. During his career, Burnsed has allocated almost \$3 million in funding for Extension facilities and programs. Burnsed has been integral in developing the local Master Gardener program. In 2014, the program was nonexistent. Recently, the Master Gardeners recorded over 4,300 hours, and the program has trained over 100 volunteers. Additionally, Burnsed assisted with an international radon mitigation research project.



SOUTHERN REGION - GEORGIA

2025 Western Region Hall of Fame Award **Ron Cunningham** Wyoming 38 Years - Retired



Ron Cunningham began working as an Extension agent with the University of Wyoming in 1977 and retired in 2015. During this time, Ron made a profound impact on the clientele in Fremont County, his colleagues, and everyone around him.

Ron has been awarded countless awards and honors over the years at every level (county, state, national). As a life-member of NACAA and our state association WACAA, he was awarded the Career Achievement Award in 1981. He then went on to win the Distinguished Service Award in 1986 and was Wyoming's Outstanding Educator of the Year in 2011. Throughout his career, he was also recognized several times for his outstanding abilities winning the Jim Dubree Excellence in Extension Award in 1998 (highest honor in UW Extension) and the Meritorious 4-H Award in 2003. Finally, in 2023 following his retirement from Extension, Ron was inducted into the Wyoming Cowboy Hall of Fame.

During Ron's Extension career, he was always the epitome of a leader and organizer of educational events. He served as the president of the Wyoming Association of County Agriculture Agents multiple times (1982-1984 and 2001-2004). He also led major organizing efforts and initiative teams for Agriculture and Natural Resources programming across Wyoming unlike any other person in UW Extension's history. Many of the major events that he organized are still ongoing today. Major programs such as the Fremont County Farm and Ranch Days, Cattle Artificial Insemination schools, and the Lander Valley Garden Expo were started during Ron's tenure and continue to be some of the absolute best annual Extension programs offered in Wyoming today!

Ron has always been a valued member of his community and has continued to be involved in a variety of youth development efforts. Ron has especially excelled in using meats judging and livestock 4-H projects as a tool to help multiple generations of youth realize their full potential. Also, Ron has always been committed to maintaining the Fremont County Youth Camp and keeping summer camp opportunities available to youth. Ron continues to have an everlasting positive influence on futures of nearly every young person that he meets. His commitment and dedication to helping people has never wavered. Even nowadays, Ron is an active and valued 4-H volunteer. He is currently the board Director of the Fremont County Youth Camp and member of the Wyoming Animal Damage Management Board.

Having Ron inducted into the NACAA Hall of Fame makes us all in Wyoming very proud! He is the perfect person to receive this great honor.

2025 North Central Region Hall of Fame Award **Stan Moore** Michigan 32 Years - Retired



Stan Moore's gentle, patient, humble leadership has been proven effective locally, statewide and nationally, both professionally and personally. He is effective because of his approach and the respect he affords others.

His service as President (2011) of the National Association of County Agricultural Agents (NACAA), President (2012) of the Board of the Joint Council of Extension Professionals (JCEP) and NACAA Policy Chair (2017-19) only highlights his lifetime of service within NACAA, Michigan Association of Extension Agents (MAEA) and within his role as a Sr. Extension Educator with Michigan State University. In retirement, Stan continues to serve the association through his involvement with the NACAA Foundation as Trustee. He has been recognized in 2021 by the Michigan State University President with the Distinguished Academic Staff Award. He is a 2008 NACAA Distinguished Service Award (DSA) honoree.

Through his work with employees and employers, he helped many agricultural employers navigate changing employment rules and grow in their ability to effectively lead and develop employees. His research has been published and cited in peer reviewed journals and he is often invited to speak at major conferences, most recently at the 2021 Ag Labor Forum of the National Council of Agricultural Employers and at the 2021 MILK Business conference.

As a Farm Management Educator, Moore worked to help farm families better understand their business through farm financial analysis. Sitting together at kitchen tables, in farm offices or in Zoom meetings, he taught and counseled as he analyzed. He developed a monthly Zoom users group of farmers across the state interested in improving their skill of farm financial record keeping. One farmer said of Stan: (he) "has been an exceptional leader in MSU Extension. He is committed to helping farmers and always demonstrates his ability and desire to go above and beyond."

Mentoring others is a large part of how Stan develops people. In 2021 he underwent a series of professional development training to become an approved coach with the Great Lakes Leadership Academy Fellowship Program.

Stan is a positive force in his rural Michigan Community. He served as chair of the Antrim County Petoskey Stone Festival, an annual weekend festival that draws thousands in celebration of a unique fossil stone found along the Lake Michigan coast. He also served on the Antrim County Planning Commission for 23 years.

Stan is active in his church, serving as a board member and member of the missions committee. He also serves in the community as a member of the board of Good Samaritan Family Services, a nonprofit organization that meets real needs of families. Serving as HR director since 2014 and chair from 2021-2024, Stan led the organization as it grew to serve over 2,000 clients per month, with a budget of almost \$700,000 annually.

Through education, coaching, and servant leadership, Stan Moore meets the needs of individuals and families, on farms and in the community. He has led and continues to lead through faithful service, and he encourages individuals to become better and meet their goals.

2025 Northeast Region Hall of Fame Award **Glenn F. Rogers** Vermont 35 Years - Retired



Glenn Rogers, (Extension Professor Emeritus) promoted knowledge, success, and the love of agriculture to all he encounters in the agriculture industry. Glenn was raised on the family farm in Westford,Vermont introducing him to his passion and dedication to the agriculture industry. The farm motivated him to work hard, learn more, have a passion and dedication to the Ag industry. He earned a B.S. in Animal Science/Vocational Technical Education (1973), a M.S. in Animal Science (1975), and took additional graduate courses in Ag Economics from UVM.

From 1975-1982 Glenn was a County Agriculture Agent in Grafton County NH. He worked in agronomy, horticulture, and dairy. He attended New England Ag Extension conferences and attended his first NACAA conference. The NACAA conferences soon became an integral part of Glenn's continued education for himself, his family, and those he served. He moved to UVM Extension serving many roles including Water Quality agent, County Agricultural Agent, Regional Dairy Specialist, Regional Farm Business Management Specialist achieving the rank of Extension Professor at the University of Vermont.

Glenn also served his country from 1971-1992 in the 134th Fighter Squadron as a Command Post technician, Air Operations Specialist, Administration supervisor, and a member of the NCO Council and NCOIC.

In 1990 U.S. Senator Patrick Leahy requested his assistance on the composition of the 1990 Farm Bill. He was granted a leave of absence, and the opportunity would also expand his comprehension and experience about varying philosophies, backgrounds, disciplines, and agriculture diversity of our nation. This contributed to his growth and mentorship in the agriculture industry.

Spreading knowledge was important to Glenn and he did so through publishing many articles in newsletters, newspapers, the NACAA Magazine, the American Agriculturist and communicating on local TV and Radio outlets.

He was member/Treasurer of Joint Council of Extension Professionals and on the policy committee. Glenn was a member of Vermont Association of Ag Agents, Northeast Association of County Agricultural Agents, and National Association of County Agricultural Agents. Serving as NACAA Regional Vice Director, Regional Director, Vice President, President Elect, President, Past President, Policy Chair, Education Foundation (VP/Secretary and Treasurer), Vice Chair and chair NACAA Public Relations Ag Policy committee, and vice chair of NACAA Life Member committee.

After retiring from UVM Extension he continued to learn and share his expertise while working with the Yankee Farm Credit on Ag taxation, working with the UVM Income Tax School, and the UVM Extension Maple Grants.

Glenn also served his community through serving on boards including: Champlain Valley Exposition Board of Directors, Chittenden County Sugar Makers as Board Member -Treasurer, VHCB Ag advisory Committee, VT Land Trust ag advisor, Essex Technical Center Ag Advisory Board, Vermont Farm Show where he was a board member, floor manager/ assistant manager, secretary and then a treasurer, a member and secretary of the Brookside Cemetery and then the Westford Cemetery Commission. He continues to be an active member of the Westford Historical Society spearheading the grants and building/ establishment of it's current location and it's many educational programs.

2025 Southern Region Hall of Fame Award **Robert Hochmuth** Florida 43 Years - Active



Robert (Bob) C. Hochmuth grew up on a vegetable farm on Maryland's eastern shore. After earning degrees in Agricultural and Extension Education and Entomology from the University of Maryland, Bob began his career in 1982 as a county agent with University of Delaware Cooperative Extension. Since 1988 he has worked for University of Florida IFAS Extension as a multi-county agent, regional specialized agent, and center director. Bob's 43-year career stands out for his expertise in specialty crops, impactful educational programs, exemplary leadership and mentorship, and unwavering support for the agricultural community.

A lifelong advocate for the watermelon industry, Bob has guided Florida growers in improving water, nutrient, pest and disease management, including conversion to plastic mulch and drip irrigation systems on about 6000 watermelon acres. To support the adoption of best management practices, Bob has used innovative blue-dye demonstrations to show soil water movement, provided petiole-sap testing services, and led on-farm trials of soil-moisture sensors, controlled-release fertilizer, and paper mulch. In 2009, Bob founded the Suwannee Valley Watermelon Institute, an annual program fostering education and collaboration among farmers, industry, and Extension.

As state co-leader of Small Farms and Alternative Enterprise programs from 2005 to 2017, Bob organized six statewide conferences attended by more than 2300 individuals from 60 Florida counties, 35 states, and 6 countries. He launched the Small Farms Academy (SFA) featuring hands-on interactive workshops, such as the Starting a Successful Hydroponic Business short course. Between 2010 and 2024, the SFA created 45 new programs in 24 locations serving a total of 3360 attendees. Bob's contributions to the profession include authoring or co-authoring 47 refereed journal articles and serving as PI or co-PI on grants totaling \$15 million.

Since 2014, Bob has served as center director or assistant center director of the North Florida Research and Education Center – Suwannee Valley, overseeing expansions in programs, personnel, and facilities. Bob inspires others with his can-do attitude, humor, and team building. A servant leader, Bob generously credits the contributions of others, nominates colleagues for awards, and actively seeks opportunities to support their personal and professional growth. In 2013, he earned the first-ever UF/IFAS Extension Mentor of the Year Award.

Bob has been a member of NACAA since 1982. He served as chair on four committees for the 2004 AM/PIC and as fundraising chair for AM/PIC in 2022. He was FACAA president

in 2001 and Florida Association of Extension Professionals board chair in 2002 and has served on scores of state committees. Bob is a national winner of seven NACAA awards.

Bob is active with several ag associations and community organizations. He received the first Extension Professional of the Year Award from the Florida Farm Bureau and the Trailblazer of the Year Award from the Suwannee Chamber of Commerce. Also known in the community as "Coach Bob," he served as a youth soccer and high school soccer coach for 20 years. Bob Hochmuth's distinguished career embodies NACAA core values of professional excellence, support for Extension colleagues, and public service.

They have been selected by their peers and are being recognized for excellence in their field of professionalism. WESTERN REGION - ARIZONA Ashley Hall - 8 Years



Ashley Hall serves livestock producers in Gila and Pinal Counties and provides Vegetation/GIS Data System (VGS) training across the western US. One of her major programs is the national award-winning Reading the Range program which is recognized as a premier monitoring program in Arizona and throughout the West. Her impactful outreach includes organizing livestock and rangeland workshops and fostering youth agriculture education, exemplifying her dedication to advancing sustainable rangeland management and community engagement.

WESTERN REGION - CALIFORNIA Tracy Schohr - 8 Years

Since 2017, Tracy Schohr has served as the Livestock and Natural Resources Advisor for Butte, Plumas and Sierra Counties focusing sustainable livestock production.
