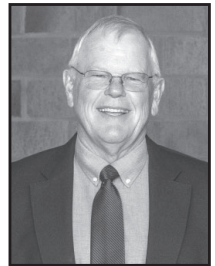

2026 SERVICE TO AMERICAN/WORLD AGRICULTURE AWARD RECIPIENT

Dr. Temple Grandin

**Colorado State University Distinguished Professor in the
Department of Animal Sciences within the College of
Agricultural Sciences**

Dr. Temple Grandin is eminently deserving of the NACAA Service to American/World Agriculture Award for her extraordinary, sustained, and measurable contributions to agriculture in the United States and around the world. For more than five decades, Dr. Grandin has provided visionary leadership in livestock handling, animal welfare, facility design, education, and public communication, resulting in permanent, positive change across the beef, pork, dairy, and livestock industries.



Dr. Grandin's work exemplifies the intent of this award: service that improves agriculture through innovation, application of science, leadership, and broad societal impact. Her contributions extend well beyond any single institution or program and have reshaped industry standards globally.

MAJOR CONTRIBUTIONS AND SCOPE OF IMPACT

Dr. Grandin is internationally recognized as one of the most influential figures in modern livestock production. Through her pioneering application of animal behavior science to facility design and handling systems, she fundamentally changed how livestock are managed throughout the supply chain. Approximately half of all cattle in the United States and Canada are handled using equipment she designed, including curved chute systems and center-track restrainers that reduce stress, improve animal welfare, enhance worker safety, and increase processing efficiency.

Her work directly addressed critical industry challenges—excessive bruising, dark cutters, handling injuries, worker safety risks, and public concern over animal welfare—by providing practical, science-based solutions that producers and processors could readily adopt. These improvements have resulted in significant economic benefits, improved meat quality, and increased consumer confidence in animal agriculture.

Dr. Grandin also led the development of objective animal welfare measurement and auditing systems, transforming animal welfare from a subjective concept into a measurable management outcome. Her scoring systems for handling and stunning are widely used by major meat processors, food

retailers, and foodservice companies. These systems are now embedded in corporate procurement policies and quality assurance programs, influencing animal care practices for millions of animals annually.

LEADERSHIP AND GLOBAL INFLUENCE

The reach of Dr. Grandin's work is truly global. She has designed livestock handling facilities and provided professional consultation in Canada, Europe, Latin America, Australia, New Zealand, and other regions. She routinely delivers invited presentations internationally and is regarded worldwide as a trusted authority on humane livestock handling and welfare assessment.

EDUCATION, SCHOLARSHIP, AND WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT

Dr. Grandin has authored more than 100 peer-reviewed scientific articles, hundreds of industry publications, and 16 books, including *Livestock Handling and Transport*, now in its sixth edition. Her scholarship consistently emphasizes practical application, ensuring research findings translate into real-world improvements. For more than 35 years, she has taught livestock handling and facility design at Colorado State University, training generations of professionals who now serve agriculture worldwide.

PUBLIC TRUST AND COMMUNICATION

A hallmark of Dr. Grandin's service is her ability to communicate effectively with both agricultural audiences and the general public. Through national and international media appearances, a widely viewed TED Talk, and an award-winning HBO film, she has strengthened public understanding of agriculture and animal welfare.

RECOGNITION AND SUMMARY

Dr. Grandin's career has been recognized with numerous national and international honors, including induction into the National Cowgirl Hall of Fame, Fellowship in the American Society of Animal Science and the American Association for the Advancement of Science, the American Farm Bureau Federation Distinguished Service Award, the OIE Meritorious Award, and the American Veterinary Medical Association Humane Award. In 2025, she was selected as a Portrait of a Nation Honoree by the Smithsonian National Portrait Gallery.

Dr. Temple Grandin exemplifies exceptional service, sustained leadership, and transformative impact on American and world agriculture. She is a resident of the Western Region and is excited to be the Key Notes Speaker at the opening ceremony at the 2025 NACAA Annual Meeting and Professional Improvement Conference.

2026 AM/PIC SPEAKER PROFILES

Commissioner Kate Greenberg

Kate Greenberg was the first woman appointed to serve as Colorado's Commissioner of Agriculture by Governor Jared Polis in December 2018. As Commissioner, Greenberg provides leadership and direction to the Colorado Department of Agriculture and its over 300 employees. Commissioner Greenberg has worked in various aspects of agriculture, from boots-on-the-ground experience to advocating for family farmers through two federal Farm Bills.



Prior to her appointment, Greenberg was the Western Program Director for the National Young Farmers Coalition (NYFC), where she established and grew the organization's presence and membership across the West. In her role as Western Director, she organized farmers and ranchers to advocate for state and federal policies that best serve them. Her work focused on farmland affordability, ag education, protecting water for agriculture and expanding access to capital and credit for young and beginning producers.

Leading up to her tenure at NYFC, Greenberg farmed on various operations across the West, managed Western policy field programs through her alma mater, Whitman College, and worked in natural resource education and restoration from eastern Washington to Mexico's Colorado River Delta. Greenberg was also involved in the development of the Colorado Water Plan and Colorado River Basin water policy, advocating for policies that keep water in agriculture.

Greenberg is the recipient of the Emerging Conservation Leader Award from Western Resource Advocates and an awardee of the 2019 Who's Who In Agriculture recognition from Colorado Farm Bureau and the Denver Business Journal. She graduated from Water Education Colorado's Water Leaders flagship course in 2018 and sits on the board of the Quivira Coalition, which brings ranchers, scientists, and conservationists together to practice land stewardship at the radical center.

As Commissioner, Greenberg serves on numerous boards and commissions, including the Colorado Water Conservation Board, Colorado Parks and Wildlife, and the Colorado State Fair Board. While she currently spends much of her time on Colorado's Front Range and traveling the state, she still calls Durango, Colorado home.

Dr. Temple Grandin Colorado State University

Temple Grandin is a Distinguished Professor of Animal Science at Colorado State University. Facilities she has designed for handling livestock are used by many companies around the world. She has also been instrumental in implementing animal welfare auditing programs that are used by McDonalds, Wendy's, Whole Foods, and other corporations. Temple has appeared on numerous TV shows such as 20/20 and Prime Time. Her books include: *Thinking in Pictures*, *Livestock Handling and Transport* and *The Autistic Brain*. Her books *Animals in Translation* and *Visual Thinking* have been on the New York Times Bestseller List. Temple was inducted into the National Women's Hall of Fame in September



2017, in 2022 was named a Colorado State University Distinguished Professor, and in 2023 was inducted into the Colorado Authors' Hall of Fame.

Rico Munn, Executive Vice Chancellor, Colorado State University

Rico Munn serves as CSU's Executive Vice Chancellor. He will hold this title until June 30, 2027, when he will become the next chancellor of the Colorado State University System. He previously held the role of Vice President for Metro Denver Engagement and Strategy where he oversaw the CSU Spur campus and led efforts to deepen the university's engagement in the metro Denver region. Munn has also served as Chief of Staff to CSU President Amy Parsons.



Prior to his work at CSU, he spent a decade as superintendent of Aurora Public Schools. His experience also includes more than a decade of legal practice and public service as executive director of the Colorado Department of Higher Education and of the Colorado Department of Regulatory Agencies. He served on the Board of Governors of the CSU System from 2013-2020, including two years as chair; on the Colorado Board of Education from 2003-2007; and currently serves on the Board of Directors for Midland University. Munn graduated with a BA from Midland Lutheran College and earned his juris doctorate from the University of Denver Sturm College of Law. He also has a graduate certificate in crisis management from St. Joseph's University.

James Pritchett, Vice President for Engagement and Extension

James Pritchett serves as the Vice President for Engagement and Extension. In his role, Pritchett oversees teams responsible for CSU Extension, Colorado State 4-H, the Colorado Water Center, the Colorado State Forest Service, and CSU Spur.



Pritchett is a seasoned university leader committed to serving Colorado, its diverse agricultural and urban communities, and CSU's land grant mission. He has served CSU in many leadership roles including as dean of the College of Agricultural Sciences and director of the Agricultural Experiment Station; assistant vice president for Engagement; and executive associate dean for the College of Agricultural Sciences. He joined the College of Agricultural Sciences faculty in 2001.

Originally from southeastern Colorado, Pritchett is a two-time CSU alum who has bachelor's and master's degrees in agricultural economics from the university, and a Ph.D. from the University of Minnesota in Agriculture and Applied Economics. Pritchett is a land grant economist who has worked in a wide range of teaching, research and engagement activities including agribusiness management, water resource economics, community development and interdisciplinary land management strategies.

Michele Payn, CSP

Michele Payn, CSP, connects the people and science of food and farming as principal of Cause Matters Corp. She is known for being a community catalyst, a passionate advocate for global agriculture - and antagonizing people into action. Michele has worked with farmers in more than 25 countries and raised millions of dollars for 4-H & FFA. 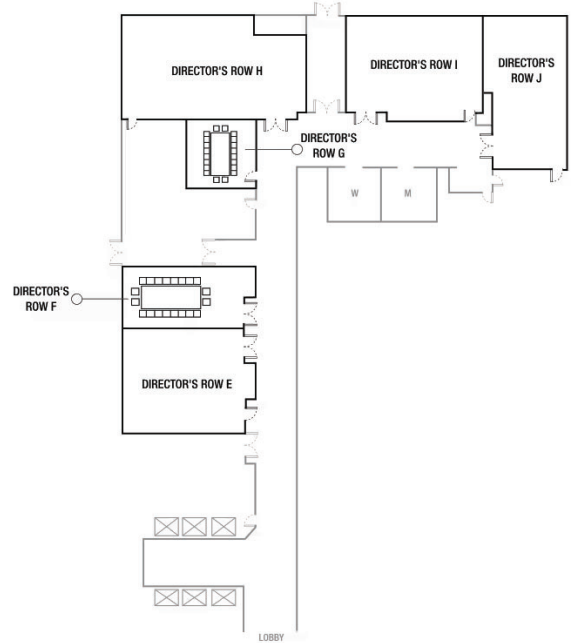

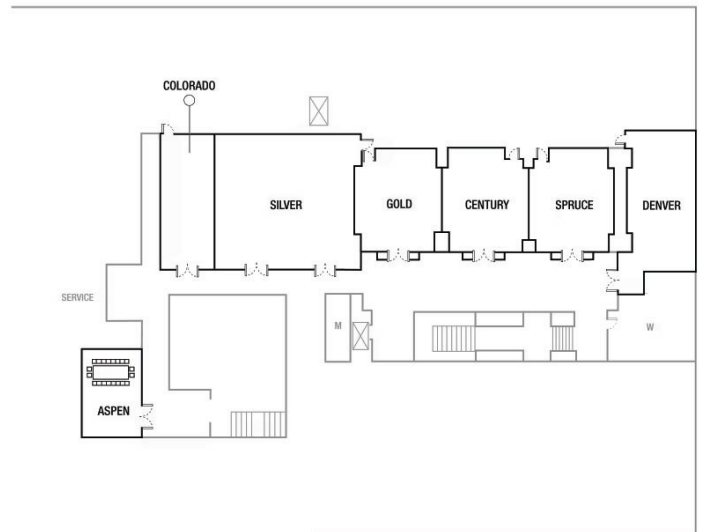

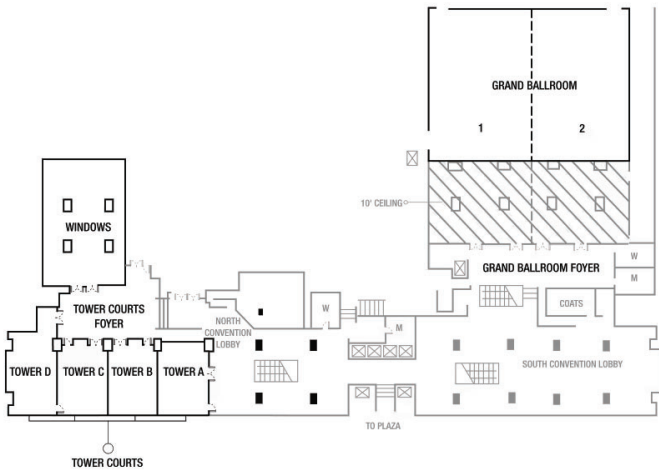


I.M. PEI TOWER MEZZANINE LEVEL

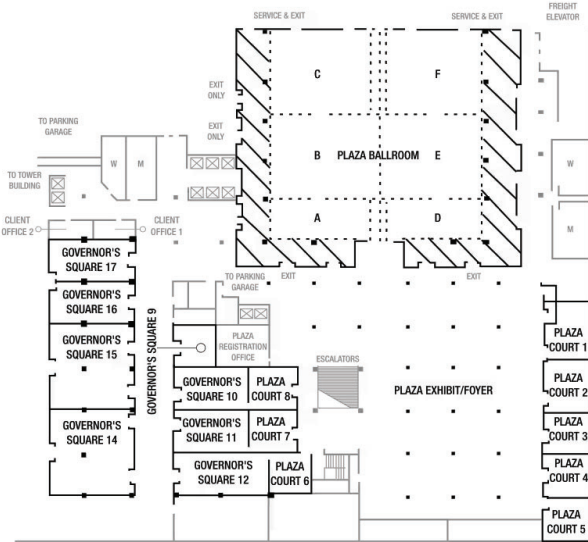
