



## GOV. HUTCHINSON TO SPEAK

Arkansas Governor Asa Hutchinson will be welcoming you all to the state this morning during the General Session.

Hutchinson is serving as the state's 46th governor. Before being elected governor, Asa Hutchinson served as Director of the Drug Enforcement Administration and as the first Undersecretary of the Department of Homeland Security. Voters in Arkansas's Third District also elected him to Congress three times.

A graduate of the University of Arkansas law school, Asa Hutchinson, at age 31, was appointed by President Reagan as the nation's youngest U.S. attorney.



He and his wife Susan have been married 42 years. They have four children and five grandchildren.

The governor will be introduced by Dr. Mark Cochran, vice president-agriculture, and head of the University of Arkansas System Division of Agriculture.

## QUICK LOOK: ARKANSAS' CAPITOL

The State Capitol is a great source of pride for the citizens of Arkansas. It is a symbol not just of government but also of the state and its people. The current Arkansas State Capitol was constructed between 1899 and 1915 on the site of the old state penitentiary using prison labor.

The neo-classical style of the building is a common example of monumental architecture of the early 20th century. It is a replica of the US Capitol and has been used in many movies as a stand in. The Arkansas State Capitol building features Arkansas granite and six bronze doors and three chandeliers crafted by Tiffany's of New York.

The dome has a 24-karat gold plated cupola. The marble on the floors and walls came from Vermont, the columns from Colorado, and the

grand staircases from Alabama.

The exterior limestone was quarried near Batesville, Arkansas while a softer Indiana limestone was used for the dome.
