



Ireland Ag & Cultural Tour June 24 - July 1, 2026

****Tuesday, June 23rd - Overnight flight to Dublin, Ireland.***

Day 1 (Wednesday, June 24) - Morning arrival and departure customs to meet your tour manager. Start the tour traveling to Tinahely to visit the Orchard Centre, with a majority of the farm dedicated to dairy production. Enjoy a BBQ lunch at the farm including a toast with Bailey's famous Irish Cream. Next, stop at Kilkenny Castle, a majestic 12th-century fortress in Ireland, beautifully restored, reflecting centuries of Norman, Victorian, and modern Irish history. Dinner on your own this evening.

Day 2 (Thursday, June 25) - After breakfast at the hotel, depart for Cork and stop at a 300 acre sheep farm with 42 acres dedicated to cereals. Guests will learn about how a sheep farm operates from breeding season in October to lambing in mid March. The historic house on the farm dates back to 1798. Next, visit the Rock of Cashel, the seat

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of kings and medieval bishops for 900 years. Take some free time in Cashel for lunch before continuing to Cork. Visit a family grain farm of over 675 hectares divided into tillage, beef and dairy. All of the cereals produced here are stored and processed locally for sale directly to nearby farms. Dinner on your own at one of the many restaurants in the city of Cork.

Day 3 (Friday, June 26) - Start this day with a tour of the English Market. This market was created in 1788 by the Protestant corporation that controlled the city until 1841. Throughout the years, fish, fowl, fruit, vegetable and bread were added and this same market still stands today. Afterwards, visit a commercial nursery of field grown trees. They are proud suppliers of trees to famous golf courses and clubs along with notable private clients. Later, continue to Kinsale and take in some free time for lunch on your own. Explore Charles Fort, constructed in the late 17th century, one of the largest military forts in the country. Next, head to Kinsale Mead Company for a tasting. Mead, believed to be the world's oldest alcoholic drink, is fermented from honey, with a variation in tasting from dry to very sweet. Return to Cork for dinner on your own and an overnight stay.

After the show, continue to Limerick for dinner on your own.

Day 5 (Sunday, June 28) - After breakfast, depart for Galway with a scenic journey to the famous Cliffs of Moher, one of Ireland's most beloved visitor experiences. Walk the paved pathways and take in sweeping views of the rugged west Clare coast along Europe's most westerly edge. Spend some free time in the charming village of Doolin for lunch on your own before traveling through the Burren, a striking region known for its lunar-like limestone landscape and unique flora, including nearly 20 species of orchids. Next, visit a growing small-scale beef farm in the area. Arrive in Galway, a vibrant city celebrated for its colorful streets, lively arts scene, and welcoming atmosphere, where medieval charm blends with modern energy. Later, enjoy a group dinner together at

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your hotel in Galway.

Day 6 (Monday, June 29) - Enjoy a full-day tour of the scenic Connemara circuit, a landscape defined by winding rivers, sparkling lakes, woodlands, rich meadowlands, rugged hills, and dramatic mountains. Stop at Diamonds Equine Renvyle, a family-run farm on the west coast renowned for five generations of breeding, training, and competing with champion Connemara ponies. Afterwards, continue to the enchanting Kylemore Abbey and Victorian Walled Garden. Nestled against a backdrop of forested hills and a tranquil lake, this neo-Gothic castle—built as a private residence in the 19th century and later transformed into an abbey in the 1920s—offers both history and beauty in equal measure.
